All we have to do is find it and save it somewhere else so it doesn’t get deleted when you clean up your temp files.

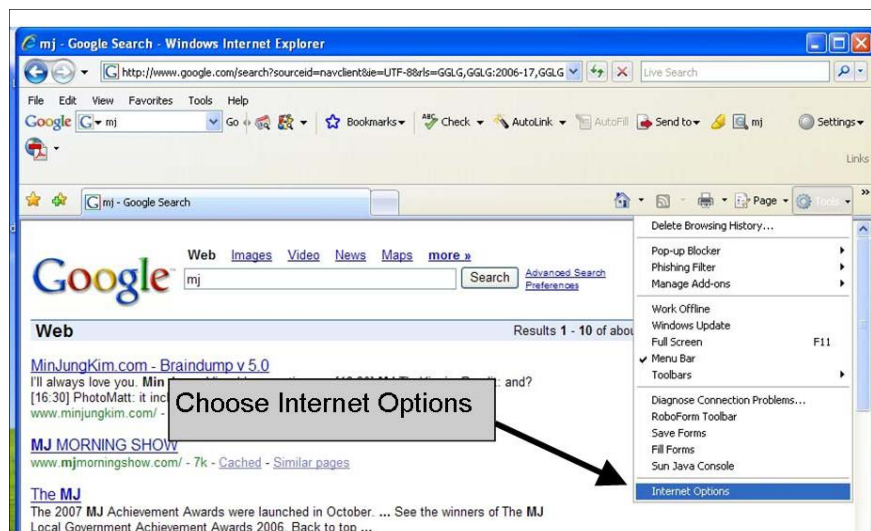
Senior Instructor Tim Neddy did the detective work for this and here are his steps.

With your Internet Browser open, look for the “Tools” icon.
Click on it.

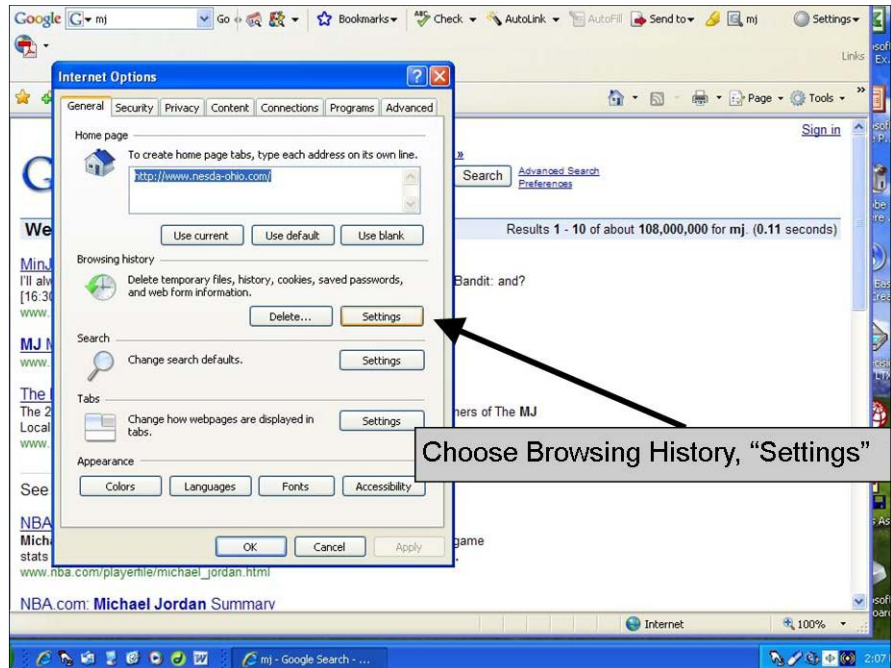
In this case the picture is IE7



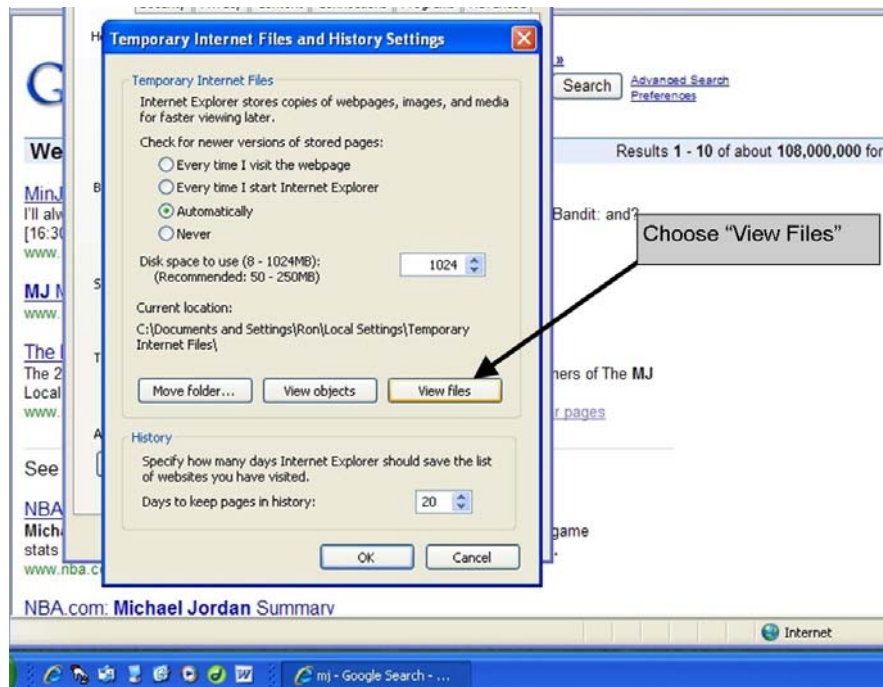
Next, choose “Internet Options” from this drop down.



Now choose
"Settings" in the
Browsing History
Category



We choose
"View Files"
From this next
box that opens.



And on this last screen that opens up, of all our current temporary internet files, we look for the movie we have just watched.

This list can be huge. I “sorted” it by date, so the newest files were at the top.

Then in the “Type” column, I looked for something that would suggest a video, in this case, I saw a QuickTime movie listed.

And in the “Name” this was indeed the video I had just watched.

Right click it and copy.

Paste into a new folder that won’t get deleted and that is easy for you to find another time.
